-a courses are offered in the Fall, b courses are offered in the Spring. ab courses are offered in the Fall and Spring. a/b courses are offered in the Fall or Spring.

## **Subfield Requirements**

Students must qualify in Formal Theory by exam; there is no certification by coursework.

For students entering in Fall 2023 or later: students must take math camp, PLSC 518, and PLSC 520 before taking the exam.

For students entering before Fall 2023: students must take math camp and PLSC 518 before taking the exam.

Students are reminded that they cannot count a course in more than one field. For example, if they take 519 to certify in Political Economy, then they cannot take it to certify in Formal Theory.
