Subfield Requirements

Students who entered the program before Fall 2021 are strongly encouraged to qualify in Qualitative Methods by coursework. Students who entered in the program in Fall 2021 or later may only qualify in the field by coursework.

To qualify by coursework, students must take three courses: 505; either 522 or 799; and either 523 or 527. Additionally, students must write a paper using qualitative methods, in the context of a course in the sequence, that shows a strong command of the methodological approaches in the field.
